Worshipful Masters Message

My brethren there is a fantastic piece in the October 2014 Short Talk Bulletin. It deals with a very tough and serious truth. It asks you how your lodge is perceived. In the article it refers to a story of a traveler in a strange land that stumbles upon a restaurant. It looks unkempt, dirty, and in a state of disrepair. When the traveler asks others about the restaurant no one has any firsthand knowledge of it because of its appearance. But unbeknownst to all this restaurant's food was exquisite. But who would notice if everyone just looked at the exterior and does not attempt to see what kind of a treasure is hidden in plain sight.

Now while this piece did talk mainly about the physical deterioration of a lodge and its importance. I see a deeper message that is just as important as the physical appearance of your lodge within our community. But also, the actual participation that your lodge has within the community. Sadly, I do not think that we are visible enough within our individual communities. Partly I feel this is because of the lack of opportunities that used to be more readily available in the past. But also, because there are too few of us available on a regular basis to attend to any additional duties. It is not only important to do the job but to do it exceptionally. Taking on another task or duty and only following through with the motions are not beneficial to the appearance of the lodge within the public's eye. This is the duty of every member of this lodge. It is all of our duties to make this lodge what it is truly capable of becoming once again. Assist us in showing the town's first responders the respect and admiration that they deserve. Assist us in starting up a community beautification effort. Assist us in showing a spirit of community involvement that could reap immeasurable dividends.

This outward appearance is not only of the public appearance of our lodge but as us as Masons. Our actions and outward demeanor should always reflect the principles that this lodge has imparted on you. When you wear something as simple as a masonic ring you are representing not only yourself, but me and every other brother in the lodge as a likeminded individual that will share in the same feelings and thoughts as yourself. Our actions as men are linked forever. Remember those words spoken to you as you were placed in the northeast corner. Remember to ever act, walk, and conduct yourself as such before God and man.

The View from the West R.W.Scott P Vicari ATTGM

On the Level Sixty-five years ago, on March 5th, Elvis Presley was honorably discharged from the United States Army. Elvis was drafted into the Army in 1958 and, instead of being upset about the interruption of his skyrocketing career, he was proud to serve, saying; "It's a duty I've got to fill and I'm gonna do it." Because of his fame (he was one of the biggest names in show business at the time) he was offered a very sweet deal; spend the next two years in the "Special Services" branch entertaining the troops like all the other big stars. No grueling boot camp, no long marches with a full pack under harsh conditions, just business as usual on the stage. Only this time, the audience would be mostly guys!

Elvis declined the offer, choosing instead to serve in the regular Army; he wanted to be, "just one of the guys." After six months at Fort Hood, Elvis was sent to Friedberg, West Germany where he spent the next eighteen months in Company "D", first battalion, 32nd Armor, 3rd Armored Division, 7th Army. He was eventually promoted to the rank of Sergeant before his enlistment ended in 1960. As far as I am aware, Elvis was not a brother Mason, but he sure did exemplify many of our core values, in this example; duty, honor, and especially being on the level. As Senior Warden, I find that I have an increased awareness of the symbolism of the level as the image of a level is both on my person and surrounding me while in lodge. Being on the level is, in my opinion, second only to "the square of virtue and morality" as the greatest tenet of freemasonry. In his book, "The Craft and Its Symbols," Allen E. Roberts states;" Freemasonry in its formative years endeavored to create a level, a universal brotherhood where men could achieve mutual respect and understanding." In the early 18th century, when modern Freemasonry was being established, there existed as much or more conflict between and within the major religious faiths. It was important to the founders of the fraternity to create a safe space for the exchange of ideas and knowledge. That is why they kept out of lodge those things that divide men; religion, politics and nationhood. This enables us, as Roberts states; "Regardless of a mason's political beliefs, his religion, or nationality, he can meet upon the level with his brethren in a Masonic lodge." I find that it is often difficult to keep discussions of religion completely out of lodge, as our symbols and allegories are wrapped in religious origins. However, we should limit our discussions in lodge to the moral lessons these symbols and stories teach us, and not the belief systems that birthed them, to preserve "the peace and harmony" of the lodge.

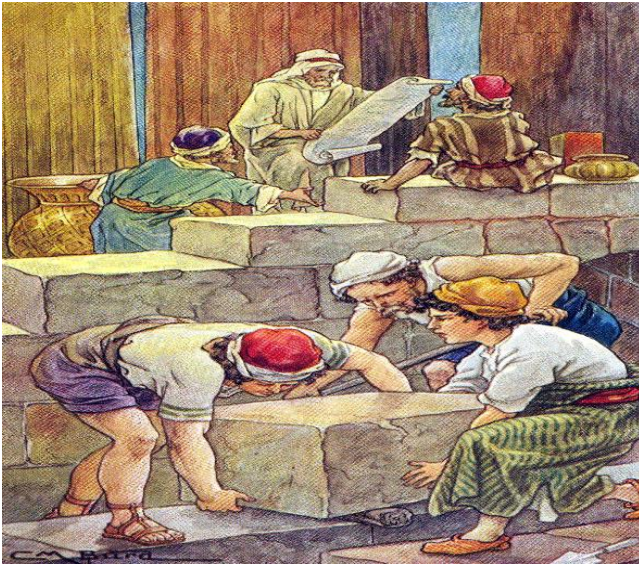
